# GENERAL CONDITIONS

The Hamilton Eisteddfod General Conditions describe the competition rules and guidelines.

All competitors in the Hamilton Eisteddfod are required to read these General Conditions prior to entering the competition. General Conditions are reviewed and updated annually.

## ENTRIES

1. **Entries open on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2022.**  
**Entries close at midnight on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> April 2022.**  
Entries must be submitted on the STARDOM online competition system by the closing date. All entries must comply with the General Conditions at the time of entry.
2. The entrant's age on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January of the current year shall be deemed the age of the entrant.
3. For schools, a tax invoice is generated upon entry and payment is to be made within 30 days. **Ensure that you provide an official school email address when entering (not an individual teacher's email address).**
4. Fees are payable to the City of Hamilton Eisteddfod. Competitors are not entitled to any refund of fees.
5. The Hamilton Eisteddfod cannot be responsible for entries lost through failed electronic transmission, or entries submitted incorrectly via the STARDOM online competition system. No entry will be accepted unless processed online with full payment.
6. Responsibility for correct entry rests with the entrant. A confirmation email will be sent to the competitor and it is their responsibility to confirm all the details of the entry are correct.
7. Dates, session times and running sheets will be available on the Hamilton Eisteddfod website ([www.hamiltoneisteddfod.org.au](http://www.hamiltoneisteddfod.org.au)) once the program is finalised.
8. When entering duets, duos or trios, **the name of each competitor must be given** at the time of entry or entries will not be accepted.
9. In Dance duos and trios, an entrant may enter more than once in the same section provided that a different genre of dance is performed.
10. No item (by a competitor or group) is to be performed again in another section.
11. **Entries must be received before the advertised closing date and time.** Late entries will only be considered when a written case is presented to the Executive, outlining exceptional circumstances. Factors such as final timetable capacity and program deadlines will affect the Executive's decision. If accepted, late entries are subject to an additional late fee of \$25 (in addition to the standard entry fee). Adjustment to entries after the closing date will incur a fee of \$10.

## ADJUDICATORS

12. Communication with the Adjudicator is prohibited during the competitions, whether by competitors, teachers or interested parties.
13. The Committee reserves the right to use a substitute Adjudicator in any section.
14. The Adjudicator reserves the right to withhold any prize where insufficient merit has been displayed.
15. Competitors who do not adhere to the conditions set out in the schedule for their section will not be eligible to receive prize money and/or trophies in that section.

## GENERAL ADVICE

16. Competitors must report to the Registration Desk (located in the front foyer) prior to the start of each **session** in which they will compete (e.g. morning session, afternoon session or evening session).
17. Time limits will be adhered to. In Music, unless otherwise stated, all time limits will be 4 minutes. Dance, Speech and Drama time limits are outlined in the respective Schedules. Performance time is taken from the start of correct music. In the case of Dance performances where the dancer starts his/her routine on stage prior to the music, performance time is taken from the time the routine starts. Competitors exceeding time limits for their section may be penalised.
18. Competitors are not permitted to rehearse or practise on the Hamilton Performing Arts Centre stage or piano in the two weeks immediately before the commencement of the Competition. For Dance, this is measured as two weeks prior to the commencement of the Dance Competition week, and for Music, this is measured as two weeks prior to the commencement of the Music Competition week. Any entrant or entrants not observing the condition will be automatically disqualified.
19. If a Music or Dance competitor requests a 'critique only' for a section that is a prerequisite for a Scholarship section, they are not eligible for the Scholarship section. Requests to perform for a critique only must be approved by the Executive.
20. Competitors acknowledge that they compete at their own risk.

## MUSIC CONDITIONS

Note that all competitors should read **all** General Conditions. There are Conditions in other sections of this document which apply to Music competitors also.

21. Tuning for instrumental group sections shall be allowed on stage, with curtains closed, for a maximum of 2 minutes for groups of less than 15 competitors, and a maximum of 5 minutes for groups comprising 15 or more competitors.
22. A stage plan is needed for all orchestral and band sections stating the number of chairs and music stands required and the layout of these. The stage plan is to be handed in at registration, labelled clearly with Section and Competitor numbers. A floorplan of the stage area is provided at the end of these General Conditions.
23. A copy of each piece of music (preferably a full score, not set parts) must be handed in to the Registration Desk for the Adjudicator before the commencement of the sessions for piano, instrumental, vocal, choral and electone. **The copy is to be marked with Section number and Competitor number.**
24. A student may enter in only two consecutive grades of Music in the current Eisteddfod.
25. Competitors are not permitted to repeat a piece that has received a 1<sup>st</sup> placing in the previous year at the Hamilton Eisteddfod.
26. Sheet music provided must include **a bar number at the beginning of each line of music**. Competitors may write these onto the sheet music by hand.
27. Competitors must use original music or have permission from the relevant owners of copyright to make and use any copies of music in the Hamilton Eisteddfod. If competitors use photocopied works or copies of sound recordings, they must warrant they have secured permission from the relevant owners of copyright to make the photocopy or copy. The photocopy will be destroyed by the Eisteddfod

Committee after use. Schools may use 'AMCOS' stamped photocopies as per the AMCOS agreement. Each entrant will be required to complete Copyright Permission Forms 1, 2 & 5 as part of the STARDOM online entry process. Hamilton Eisteddfod holds an APRA licence.

28. An official accompanist is available. A fee of \$7 will apply for each section. Entrants must use STARDOM online competition system to indicate they need the accompanist and pay at the time of entry.
29. Within the Music competitions, recorded music may only be used for Modern Vocal, Animated Movie Vocal and Instrumental sections. The Committee will provide equipment and staff to operate said equipment.
30. The use of microphones is not permitted, with the exception of all Modern Vocal sections.
31. For the purposes of the Hamilton Eisteddfod, a 'concert band' is a performing ensemble consisting of members of the woodwind, brass, and percussion families of instruments, along with the double bass or bass guitar. On rare occasions, non-traditional instruments may be added.

## DANCE CONDITIONS

Note that all competitors should read **all** General Conditions. There are Conditions in other sections of this document which apply to Dance competitors also.

32. A 'Novice' is a competitor who has never won a first, second or third prize in any solo genre at any age level in any eisteddfod as of the Hamilton Eisteddfod closing date for entries (see General Condition 1). (That is, if you have ever won a prize for dancing you are not a 'Novice' for the purpose of the Hamilton Eisteddfod).
33. Lyrical dance may include neo-classical, modern, and neo modern.
34. Dance sections may be split if there are more than 18 entries.
35. Dance Troupes must contain a minimum of 5 dancers.
36. A competitor who commences performing and stops is allowed one restart and will receive a critique but no official marks or placing (except when the wrong music has been played and the fault is quickly corrected). The restart will be allowed subject to Adjudicator, safety and practical considerations.

## SPEECH AND DRAMA CONDITIONS

Note that all competitors should read **all** General Conditions. There are Conditions in other sections of this document which apply to Speech and Drama competitors also.

37. A copy of the item to be performed **must** be handed in to the Registration Desk on registration.
38. No microphones are to be used in these sections.
39. No replica weapons or blades allowed as props.
40. No lit candles or flames allowed as props.
41. Competitors should show consideration of age appropriateness of their chosen text especially in regards to the Shakespearian monologue.

42. No prompting allowed.
43. One chair and one small table will be provided for use on stage. In sections where competitors are allowed to use their own props (according to the Schedule), they must be handheld props only. No stage sets/backdrops allowed.
44. An 'ensemble' is defined as two or more performers.

## RECORDING OF PERFORMANCES & MEDIA USE

45. The use of any digital devices by members of the audience is prohibited during competition. This includes mobile phones, tablets, cameras or video cameras. Offenders may be removed from the auditorium. The Committee reserves the right to record, photograph, broadcast and/or telecast any part of the competition.
46. The Committee reserves the right to have present, on occasions, Media Photographers or Official Photographers and to photograph items for the purpose of publicity, and use such for promotional purposes at any time. Winners' names may be made public to the local media and via other official Hamilton Eisteddfod channels.
47. Authorised Photographers may be present to film the performances in order to offer these photos for sale to parents and competitors.  
By entering the Hamilton Eisteddfod, you are agreeing to being recorded, broadcast, telecast, photographed or named according to Conditions 45, 46 and 47.

## SAFETY AND STAGE RULES

A floorplan of the stage area is provided at the end of these General Conditions.

48. Stage effects: Lighted candles, sparklers and other lighted flames are not permitted, nor any flammable props.
49. Lighting: The standard lighting rig at the Hamilton Performing Arts Centre is used for all Music and Dance sections.
50. Curtains: The black draw-curtain may be used only in Demi Character Solos, Duos & Trios and Troupes, and only if the student/troupe has an accompanying adult to operate it. No front-of-stage curtain to be used.
51. Sound: Competitors using recorded sound must notify the Registration Desk at the time of registration. **The Registration Desk must be informed of what device will be used.**  
**If CDs are to be used, these must be handed in at the Registration Desk** at the time of registering. For Dance, a CD player with operator will be provided. CDs must be named and have only one item per disc. CDs will be returned after the completion of the section, to the area opposite the Registration Desk. Please ensure that CDs are clean and in good condition.  
If iPods/iPads are to be used, each dance backing track must be on a separate playlist and have no lock code (flight mode must be turned on). The format to be used on all media is mp3.
52. **To obtain a teacher/coach pass to remain backstage**, a current VIT (Victorian Teacher's Registration) or equivalent, or a Working With Children Check needs to be presented to the Secretary's Desk, otherwise a pass will not be issued. A limit of three teacher's passes for each school will be allocated. The pass needs to be prominently displayed and will entitle the teacher to free admission to the

auditorium. A coach’s pass will not entitle the holder to free admission to the auditorium. (A ‘coach’ is an individual who is assisting a performer where no teacher is available.)

- 53. **Parents (a maximum of two) requiring access backstage or side-stage** to assist their child in the backstage dressing room or with props, must prominently display a nametag issued by the school, clearly stating the parent’s name and school. Parents are only permitted to remain backstage or side-stage during their child’s performance (unless they have been granted a coach’s pass; see General Condition 52).

## RIGHTS OF THE COMMITTEE

- 54. The Committee reserves the right to cancel or otherwise amend sections if insufficient entries are received.
- 55. The decision of the Committee in all questions and disputes arising out of or not provided for by these Conditions shall be final. All entries are received subject to this proviso and shall not be subject to any appeal at Law.
- 56. Excluding the Competition Schedule and Running Sheet, the copying by any means of any Hamilton Eisteddfod Inc. publication is not permitted without the written permission of the Committee.
